In the preparation of the Benedictine edition (Paris, 1693-1706) Jean Martianay had the assistance of Antoine Pouget, who died after the publication of v. 1.

The second "Verona" edition, from which this is reprinted, was published in Venice, 1772-76.

In v. 1 the following works are spurious: Eusebius, De morte Hieronymi; Augustini De magnificentiis beati Hieronymi; Cyrilli De miraculis Hieronymi. cf. the Admonitiones. The letter of Pope Anastasius to Simplicianus, bp. of Milan, printed as no. 95 among the letters of St. Hieronymus, is also printed in v. 20, col. 74-76, of this series.

The ascription to Sophronius by Erasmus of the Greek translation of the *viris illustribus* in v. 2 is untenable. cf. Hieronymus, Saint. *De viris inlustribus ... hrsg. ... von O. von Gebhardt*. Leipzig, 1896. p. [iii]. *Expositio interlinearis libri Job* in v. 3 in its earliest recension is the work of Philippus, disciple of St. Hieronymus. cf. Admonitio and F. Forget in Vacant. A. *Dictionnaire de théologie catholique*. paris, 1924, v. 8, col. 923.

The translation by St. Hieronymus of *Homiliae novem in visiones Isaiae Origenis Adamantii* in v. 4 is doubtful, although defended by Bardenbewer. cf. F. Forget in Vacant, *ibid.*, v. 8, col. 922; L. Schade in Buchberger, M. *Lexikon für Theologie und Kirche*. Freiburg i. B., 1933. v. 5, col. 17; Bardenhewer, Otto, *Geschichte der altkirchlichen Literatur*, 2. Aufl. Freiburg i. B., 1923. v. 3, p. 612-613.

Breviarium in Psalmos in v. 7, though spurious as a whole, nevertheless incorporates genuine Hieronymian materials. cf. Bardenhewer, *ibid.*, v. 3, p. 620.

Among the spurious works in v. 11. *Epistola V-VI* are also printed as *Epistola I-II* among the doubtful works of St. Maximus, bp. of Turin, in v. 57, col. 921-958 of this series, and *Epistola XXXI, seu Tractatus de observatione vigilarum*, is also printed as the *Opusculum primum* of St. Nicetas, bp. of Treves, in v. 68, col. 365-372, of this series, under the title, *de vigiliis servorum Dei*. The latter is now attributed to St. Nicetas, bp. of Remesiana. cf. Bardenhewer, *ibid.*, v.3, p. 603.
